If you ever travel to a Spanish-speaking country, you should be prepared for the possibility that you may be sick or have an accident. Since Sra. LeBlanc is not with you on your vacation, you must be prepared to deal with your illness/accident on your own.

In the following skit, one student will play the médico(a) while another will be un(a) estudiante who, for some reason is enfermo(a). The doctor will begin by asking some personal information (name, age, nationality, where you come from in the United States). After answering these questions, the student will then describe some medical problem. The doctor will first ask if any other parts hurt. Then, the doctor will ask about the extent of the pain(s) and what may have caused it. It is the student's job to then describe possible causes (eating something that has made the student sick, an accident, or some other creative description). The doctor will end by suggesting a remedy (what to do, what to take, etc.) Feel free to get creative with the sickness and cause. To add that authentic touch, find some costumes and props (a doctor's coat, a stethoscope, some bandages, etc.)
